A complete evaluation and strong advocacy are critical for children with learning disabilities. Families with resources can access top special education services while disadvantaged families receive little to no help without Promise.

In collaboration with Columbia University Irving Medical Center, **Promise Project provides state-of-the-art neuropsychological testing**. We pair our evaluations with culturally competent advocacy and parent training to ensure students have the tools they need to learn — all at no cost to families.

Promise is expanding our influence beyond our clinic walls:

Sooner: Through our Early Promise initiative, we are creating new tools that **identify children sooner** – in kindergarten – so we can get them on track before they fail.

Simpler: We are **developing simpler evaluations** that pinpoint each child's learning issues — allowing for targeted interventions to get them on the path to success.

Scalable: We are **scaling our program within schools** and community based organizations — reaching more children than ever before.
